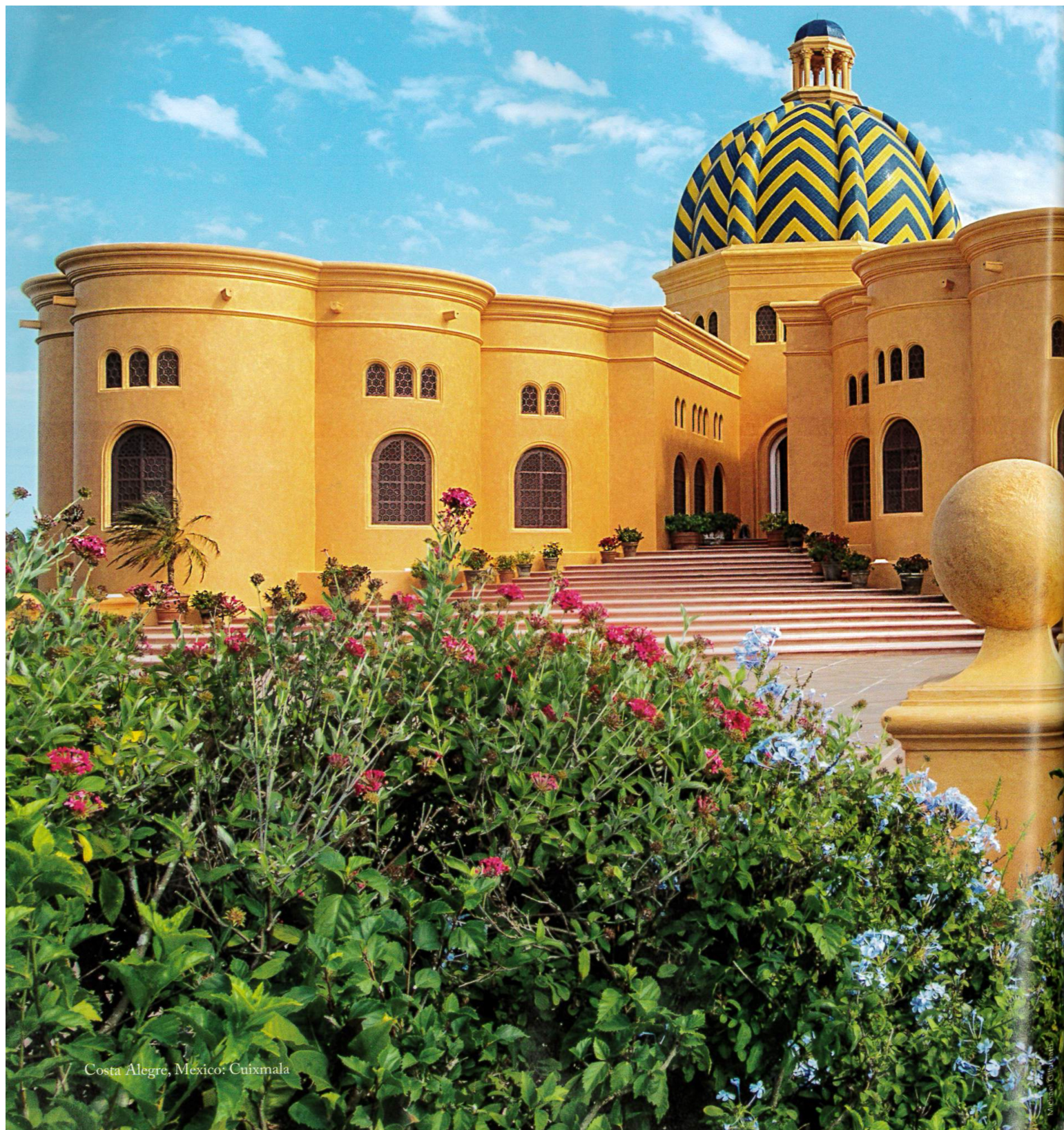

Park City, Utah **WASHINGTON** *SCHOOL HOUSE*

Destination: The former mining town of Park City has grown into a picturesque downtown—lining its main street are art galleries, boutiques, top restaurants, the High West whiskey distillery's saloon, and a chairlift to the largest ski resort in the United States.

Hotel: Built in 1889 and opened as a hotel in 2011, the building was in fact a former schoolhouse, so no two of its 12 bedrooms are alike. Now reclaimed-oak barn planks cover the floors and crystal chandeliers hang from the ceilings. Earlier this year, the hotel opened its largest accommodation, Apartment 528, directly across the street.

Bespoke Experiences: When Netflix took over the hotel during the Sundance Film Festival, the living room became a boardroom by day and a dining room by night. The entire property from lights to signage was rebranded as an extension of Netflix. All furnishings in the place can be moved and reconfigured and the artworks can be changed out. The hotel's screening room is ideal for exclusive viewings.
